Academic Assessment Plan

- 1. Students will be able to identify and differentiate sources that are evidence based. (informational fluency)
- 2. Students with a CSD major will graduate with the skills and knowledge necessary to be accepted into graduate school (audiology or speech-language pathology) or to be employed (communication with CSD advisor)
- 3. Students will maintain an active voice in appropriate departmental discussions and decisions. (SAB/surveys)
- 4. Students will obtain the CSD major within the four-year time to degree. (Power BI)
- 5. Students who want to pursue a master's degree in speech-language pathology will acquire 25 hours of guided observation in the field. (CSD 332 and maintained by Everett)
