
Students experience belonging differently by college and discipline.

Belonging could be an indicator of whether students in a major feel the *institution's* curriculum and activities are relevant and important. This could be positive ("my institution offers a curriculum or activities relevant to me") or negative (no relevance). Considering the <u>role of belonging in student</u> <u>success at ISU</u>, it is important to build student success initiatives around institutional and college belonging.
