
## First-generation first-year students and seniors reported slightly lower levels of belonging.

First-generation students could interpret challenges navigating academic and process norms as signals they don't belong. Messaging is important for first-generation and transfer students. The most important thing a college can do to foster belonging for first-generation students is to <u>create</u> <u>opportunities for personal interactions</u> with faculty, staff, and other students.
